One semester, four movements

Every Triagon semester follows the same shape, so you can plan deadlines and cover at work months in advance. The proportions below are typical; individual modules vary.

WEEKS 1–4

Weekly evening lectures. Live, scheduled sessions with your lecturer and cohort, released as recordings afterwards, with reading and materials in the virtual learning environment.

WEEKS 5–8

Seminar & case work. Small-group discussion, tutor feedback and peer critique on the material you have just covered.

WEEK 9

Intensive week. A concentrated block of workshops and presentations, held live online across consecutive evenings.

WEEKS 10–14

Applied assessment. A workplace-anchored assignment or project, submitted and defended online.

What the week actually looks like

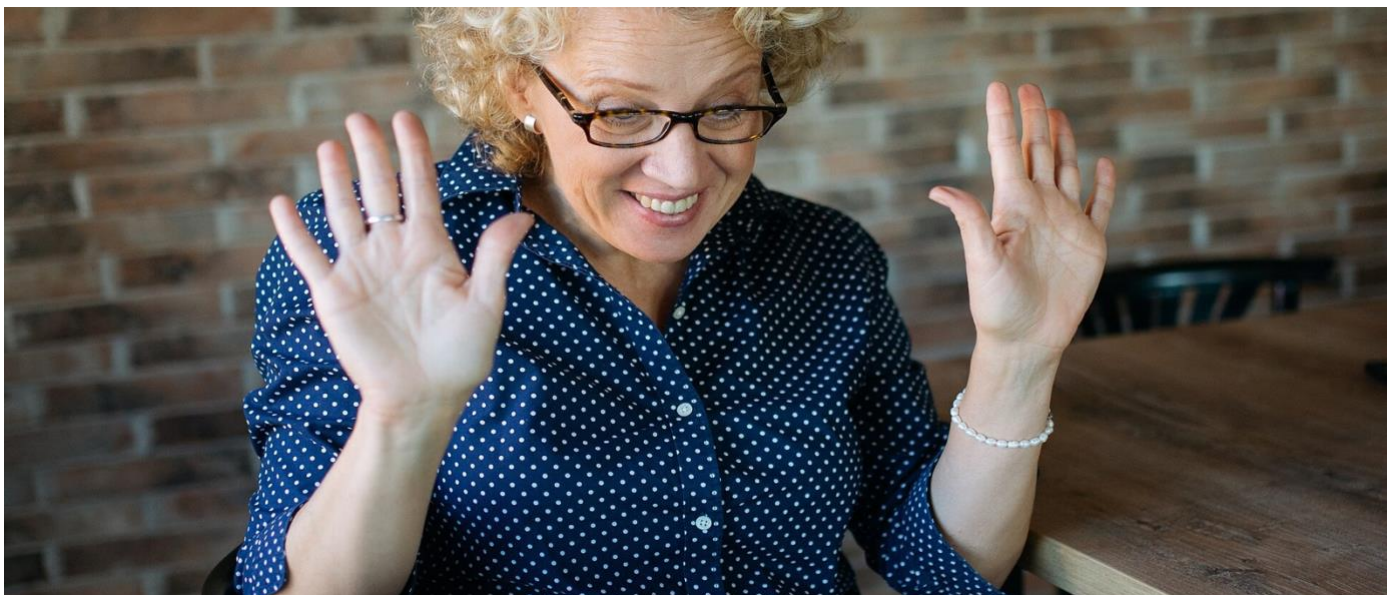
Plan on 12–15 hours a week for a part-time Master's: two evening lectures, one longer weekend block of reading, and writing spread where it fits.

Every module has a named tutor, a published deadline calendar for the whole semester, and a fixed response window for questions.

Assessment, in plain terms

We assess what you can do with the material: business cases, strategy papers, applied research, portfolios and presentations to a panel. Doctoral candidates work to a supervised research plan from the first semester.

Feedback is written, criteria-referenced and returned before the next assignment is due.



Where a Triagon award sits

Triagon Academy is licensed by the Malta Further and Higher Education Authority (licence 2018-021) to deliver programmes up to MQF/EQF Level 8. Because the Maltese framework is referenced to the European Qualifications Framework and compatible with the Framework for Qualifications of the European Higher Education Area, your award carries a level that admissions offices and employers elsewhere in Europe can read directly. A Maltese degree, studied from wherever you are

Triagon is registered in Malta — an EU member state where English is an official language — and that is where your qualification comes from. It is not, however, where you have to be. Every lecture, seminar, supervision and assessment happens online, so students study from across Europe and beyond without relocating, taking leave or changing jobs.

Live teaching is scheduled in Central European Time in the evening, which keeps the timetable workable from West Africa to the Gulf. Recordings and materials sit in the virtual learning environment for the length of your programme.

Because there is no campus attendance, there are no travel, accommodation or relocation costs to budget for — and no student visa is required to study with us.

School of Management and Law

Our largest school, and the reason most students first call us: a ladder that runs from a Bachelor's top-up through the MBA to a professional doctorate, without leaving your job at any rung.

MQF 6 • 60 ECTS • TWO SEMESTERS

B.Sc. in Business Management (Top-Up)

A one-year route to a full Bachelor's degree for holders of an appropriate diploma or advanced certificate. You complete the final 60 ECTS — strategic and applied modules plus a research project — and graduate with a named specialisation.

Six specialisations, including Marketing, Human Resources and Sector Specific Studies.

WHO IT SUITS

Diploma holders, office and operations managers, and career changers who need the degree itself rather than three more years of study.

MQF 7 • 90 ECTS • TWO SEMESTERS

M.Sc. in Leadership and Strategic Management

For managers whose next problem is people and direction rather than technique: how strategy is chosen, communicated, resourced and survived. Leadership theory, strategic analysis, change and organisational design, stakeholder influence, and a dissertation or applied project.

Single pathway — no specialisation to choose, one coherent cohort.

WHO IT SUITS

Team and department leads moving into strategic roles, public-sector managers, and specialists who now carry responsibility for other people's work.

Master of Business Administration

The general management degree, taught for people who already manage: finance and control, markets, operations, and organisational behaviour, examined through decisions you are actually making. The programme closes with a consultancy-style project on a real brief.

Seven specialisations, including Project Management, International Management and Business Psychology.

WHO IT SUITS

Managers moving into general management and P&L ownership, and technical specialists stepping into leadership. It is also the standard route into our DBA.

Doctor of Business Administration

A professional doctorate for senior practitioners who want to research a problem inside their own organisation to the standard of the field — and be read as an authority afterwards. Candidates pursue individual research projects rather than a fixed specialisation list.

Structure

STAGE 1	Research design, methods, literature review, first colloquium
STAGE 2	Fieldwork, analysis, publication-track paper, second colloquium
STAGE 3	Thesis, pre-submission review, viva voce defence — held online

Supervision is scheduled, not ad hoc: you meet your supervisor to a fixed rhythm from the first semester, and doctoral colloquia give you a standing audience of peers examining the same kind of problem.

School of Sports and Exercise Science

For coaches, trainers, physiotherapy and fitness professionals who already work with athletes and want the science, the credential and the specialisation to go with it.

Research methods, advanced theory and a specialisation taken through to an empirical dissertation. Taught live in the evening, with statistics supported in small groups rather than left to a textbook.

Doctor of Psychology (D.Psych)

Eligible students following accredited Maltese programmes and who work and pay taxes in Malta can claim a tax credit of up to 70% of course costs under Malta's Get Qualified scheme. Instalments

Three ways in

We assess applications individually. If your file is unusual, that is a conversation rather than a rejection.

A

Standard academic entry

You hold the qualification named in the school pages — a relevant diploma or advanced certificate for a top-up Bachelor's, a Bachelor's for a Master's, a Master's for a doctorate — plus the required language competence.

B

Recognition of prior learning

Documented professional experience, in-house training and professional qualifications are assessed against module learning outcomes. Successful claims can exempt you from modules or admit you without the usual award.

C

Bridging route

Where a gap remains, we may admit you with conditions: a preparatory module, a written task, or a shorter award taken first and credited towards the full degree.

Language of study

Programmes run in English and in German. If your previous education was not in the language you choose, supply an accepted certificate — IELTS, TOEFL or equivalent for English; a recognised certificate at the required level for German. A degree taught in that language is usually accepted as evidence in itself.

Documents

Transcripts and certificates in English or German, or with an official translation. Because study is fully online, there is no visa or residence process to complete.

- 1 • Enquiry call** — 20 minutes, no documents needed. We tell you which route fits.
- 2 • Application** — form, CV, transcripts, personal statement, two references.
- 3 • Academic review** — the programme lead assesses the file, including any RPL claim.
